

As you know, the WSF is a unique event that brings together the sport leagues that play in and around West Hollywood to participate in a multi-sport tournament held on the campus of the world renowned UCLA. 



There will be a rooftop swimming facility with two pools, which will connect to existing rooftop tennis courts. There will be indoor multipurpose courts for basketball, volleyball, and dodgeball — even a grand staircase for stair-run exercising.

Playing the game he says has always been the center of his social life, is mainly why LA Blades is participating in the WeHo Sports Festival.




